## Introduction to AccuRoute Desktop

AccuRoute's unmatched routing capabilities are presented to the user as **AccuRoute Desktop**, an intelligent client-side application that resembles a desktop email client. Using AccuRoute Desktop, users can create Embedded Directives and Routing Sheets and use them to streamline their common document routing practices.

AccuRoute Desktop also features a desktop printer that generates PDF files and a Windows Send To shortcut; both invoke AccuRoute Desktop automatically, allowing the user to send documents that are already open on the desktop or saved on the network.

AccuRoute Desktop is the client-side desktop application that allows network users to:

- Create and save Embedded Directives (EDs). These EDs can be used to submit messages directly to the Upland AccuRoute Server and generate Routing Sheets.
- Generate Routing Sheets. The Routing Sheets can be placed in front of hard copy documents and the set can be scanned from a multifunction device and sent to the Upland AccuRoute Server for processing.
- Submit messages directly to the Upland AccuRoute Server without using an Embedded Directive.

## Integration with DMS applications

AccuRoute Desktop supports Upland AccuRoute DMS Libraries v3.01 and later. The Upland AccuRoute DMS Libraries are a modular set of DLL files for document management systems and document repositories. They enable AccuRoute applications such as the AccuRoute Desktop to communicate with your company's document management system or other document repository. Specifically, the Upland AccuRoute DMS Libraries allow AccuRoute applications to authenticate users to the DMS application so that users can profile documents and save them in the DMS application.

Periodically Upland AccuRoute releases updates to the Upland AccuRoute DMS Libraries. Updates can include support for new document management applications and resolutions to issues in previous releases.

## Methods of submitting messages to the AccuRoute Server

The highly intelligent Embedded Directive technology requires each message to be submitted directly to the Upland AccuRoute Server for processing and routing to the final destinations.

There are several ways messages can be submitted to the AccuRoute Server; each method is explained in the figure in the next page and in the following sub sections.



## AccuRoute Web Apps

The AccuRoute Web Apps client is an intranet-based web application providing network users a convenient method of creating document distributions (Embedded Directives), generating Routing Sheets, and sending messages. For more information on AccuRoute Web Apps, refer to AccuRoute Web Apps (2-8).

### **AccuRoute COM API**

AccuRoute COM API enables you to create Visual Basic applications that generate messages and Embedded Directives and submit them to the Upland AccuRoute Server. For more information, refer to AccuRoute COM API (2-22).

### **Network scanning devices**

AccuRoute seamlessly converts any hard-copy document into searchable electronic format and delivers it as a message. A user simply scans the hard copy document with a Routing Sheet on a network scanning device, and the Upland AccuRoute Server does the rest.

A scanned document enters the AccuRoute system via AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client or an inbound connector. Specialized solutions are available for the industry's most common multifunction device models. For more information, refer <a href="AccuRoute Embedded Device Client Installation Guide">AccuRoute Embedded Device Client Installation Guide</a>.

## Components of AccuRoute Desktop

The AccuRoute Desktop application consists of three components:

### **Watch Folders application**

This is an application that starts at Windows startup and has a tray icon. The application uses Virtual Filescan implementation and gathers files that are dropped in known/specified folders and then process them through the AccuRoute Server.

#### **AccuRoute Desktop**

AccuRoute Desktop resembles an email client application in which the user can choose recipients for a message and send it. In addition to this direct send capability, the AccuRoute Desktop user can save the message as an Embedded Directive, reuse saved Embedded Directives to send new messages, add or remove existing attachments, or use an Embedded Directive to generate a Routing Sheet. It is the core component of the application suite; it can be invoked by users, the Watch Folders application, and the Send To AccuRoute Desktop shortcut.

**Note** AccuRoute Desktop contains the configuration UI for the Watch Folders application.




Figure 2-2: AccuRoute Desktop

From the main window in AccuRoute Desktop, users can send messages, create Embedded Directives, and generate Routing Sheets

### **Print to AccuRoute printer**

AccuRoute Desktop v6.0 printing is handled by the Print to AccuRoute client. Print to AccuRoute allows users to print any document to the AccuRoute PDF printer, which makes a .pdf version of that document. Then the system opens the new .pdf file in the AccuRoute Desktop, where it is available to be sent to recipients or addresses, as with any other message. Print to AccuRoute lets users take advantage of AccuRoute messaging capabilities for file formats not otherwise supported. For more information, refer to Print to AccuRoute (2-10)

## Workflows for messages and Embedded Directives

AccuRoute Desktop supports the following workflows:

Sending messages - When AccuRoute Desktop submits a message to the Upland AccuRoute
Server, the server queues it in the Dispatch component. The Dispatch component analyzes the
Outbound rules and determines a message path through the Upland AccuRoute Server's processing
queues. It directs the message to the appropriate workflow component where it is processed for
delivery. After AccuRoute Desktop has submitted the message to the Upland AccuRoute Server, it can
be tracked using the Upland AccuRoute Server Administrator.

- Creating and updating Embedded Directives When AccuRoute Desktop creates a new Embedded Directive or updates an existing Embedded Directive, the Upland AccuRoute Server updates the Embedded Directive in the message database.
- Generating and displaying Routing Sheets When AccuRoute Desktop creates a Routing Sheet
  or displays a previously generated Routing Sheet, it uses the Embedded Directive properties and the
  message attachments (send to when printing to AccuRoute Desktop or from the Send to Desktop
  shortcut) to compose a Routing Sheet on the desktop and display using the default PDF viewing
  application.

## Views associated with AccuRoute Desktop features

A view is configuration file for an AccuRoute Desktop form. All three components of the AccuRoute Desktop application suite use forms. For example, AccuRoute Desktop uses the standard form that is linked to the view file Default.VIEW. Each view file is comprised of XML data that determines the look and feel of the application, and the features that are available to the user.

Tip Upland AccuRoute provides guidelines on modifying view files so that administrators or programmers can customize views for the target environment. For a fee, an AccuRoute Technical Support engineer can assist with view file modifications or customize view files for the target environment.

Do not modify any views before using AccuRoute Desktop. Use the application in its default configuration, generate a list of specifications for deployment, and then customize the application. View files are stored on the Upland AccuRoute Server and can be updated anytime—even after AccuRoute Desktop has been installed on clients.

Users can use custom views when running AccuRoute Desktop in standard mode.

- AccuRoute Desktop loads Default.VIEW by default. The view that AccuRoute Desktop loads is determined by the property prDefaultView in AccuRouteclient.xml. This property can be modified for individual users.
- Send To AccuRoute Desktop loads DirectSent.OMV which is located in ...\AccuRouteViews on the Upland AccuRoute Server. The view can be modified as necessary, but it cannot be customized for different users and groups and cannot be moved to a different location.
- Printing a document to the AccuRoute watch folder loads the Default.VIEW. This view is determined
  by the watch folder configuration AccuRouteWatchFolder.xml which defaults to the Default.VIEW.
  Users can also modify this to be any view they want, PrintToFax.OMW, or even the PrintTo.OMV as
  necessary.

#### Views versus user preferences

Views always takes precedence over user preferences in AccuRoute Desktop. This allows administrators to use views to enforce user and group policies. (If a user sets preferences that conflict with the view, then the conflicting settings are not saved.)

#### **Inheritance**

A view can inherit configuration data from another view. Using this concept called inheritance, AccuRoute Desktop can be deployed with a hierarchal set of views that meet the needs of users and groups. In an environment that utilizes view inheritance, the view with the most general configuration data is called the **base view**, and the view that determines the AccuRoute Desktop configuration on the client is called the **derived view**. Any view that occurs between the base view and the derived view is called an **intermediate view**. For example, the view lineage can be comprised of the base view, multiple intermediate views, and the derived view.

While view inheritance can be used to propagate settings to other views, it provides versatility at the feature level. A view can override data that is inherited from another view. (Go to Overrides on 2-7.)

#### Two-view example

Consider the following example of view inheritance using two views:

- organization.view
- department.view

AccuRoute Desktop on the client is configured to load department.view. Since department.view inherits configuration data from organization.view, organization.view is the base view and department.view is the derived view.

#### Three-view example

Consider a more sophisticated example of view inheritance using three views:

- organization.view
- site.view
- department, view

AccuRoute Desktop on the client is configured to load department.view. Department.view inherits configuration data from site.view, and site.view inherits configuration data from organization.view. Department.view is the derived view, site.view is the intermediate view, and organization.view is the base view.

#### **Overrides**

A derived view can override data that is inherited from the base view. Conversely, the base view can allow or prevent the derived view from overriding all or part of the view configuration. (The attribute overridable can be set on the view itself, on general sections such as <General>, and on more specific sections such as <Recipient>. which belongs to the <Defaults> section.) This concept of overrides is detailed thoroughly in the next section that contains guidelines on modifying view files.



## Introduction to AccuRoute Web Apps

**AccuRoute Web Apps** is an intranet-based web application that provides network users a convenient method of delivering documents. Web Apps is the customizable, tile-based AccuRoute client from which users can access Applications integral to their workflow.

The intuitive Web Apps Homepage presents the user with several application tiles, from which they can create Messages, work with Distributions and Files, and set preferences. The Application options available to user groups are defined in the System Administrator.

## Messages and distributions

Users can send messages and distributions electronically and from hard copy. In both cases, the Web Apps Client delivers the document as an electronic file attachment using the recipient information.

- For messages and distributions sent electronically, users manually add a recipient or choose a
  distribution, select and add an attachment, review options and send. The system processes it using the
  associated routing information.
- For messages and distributions sent starting with a hard copy, users can print Routing Sheets to bring
  to an MFP with the document, or they can sign-in to the device and use the distributions associated
  with authenticated buttons on the device, such as Scan to Me.

## **Distribution Collections**

Users can create their own Distributions or make use of any Distribution Collections to which their user group is assigned in the AccuRoute Server. Users cannot edit an existing distribution within a Distribution Collection, but they can modify it and use Save As to generate a new one based on the original settings.

## Introduction of Print to AccuRoute Features

**Print to AccuRoute** allows users to print any document to the AccuRoute PDF printer, which makes a .pdf version of that document. Then the system opens the .pdf file in either the AccuRoute Desktop or Web Client, where it is available to be sent to recipients or addresses, just like any other message.

With Print to AccuRoute, users can take advantage of AccuRoute messaging capabilities for file formats not typically supported. The Print to AccuRoute installation offers choices:


- Print to AccuRoute Desktop

## Printing to AccuRoute Desktop

When printing a document to AccuRoute Desktop, save the document to the designated AccuRoute print watch folder (usually this is the My Documents \AccuRoute folder). Once the document is saved, it is automatically routed to AccuRoute Desktop as an attachment for a message. Here are the steps.

#### To print to AccuRoute Desktop:

- I Open a document.
- 2 Click **Print**. The **Print** dialog opens and the **Print to AccuRoute** printer is selected.



Choose the designated AccuRoute print watch folder as the location to save the file.


When the file is saved, the AccuRoute Desktop application is launched with the file as a PDF attachment.




The user can send a message with the attachment or create an Embedded Directive with the attachment. The document will be submitted to the server which will convert to the requested final form.

## Send To AccuRoute Desktop


The Send To > AccuRoute Desktop option is listed in the Windows Explorer right-click menu for files.



When the user sends a document to AccuRoute Desktop, a special form prompts the user to launch AccuRoute Desktop with the document attached or to immediately send the document using an existing Embedded Directive..



If the user sends the document using an existing Embedded Directive, AccuRoute Desktop sends the message immediately. If the user launches AccuRoute Desktop, the form appears on the desktop and the document is attached.

## Introduction to AccuRoute Queue

**AccuRoute Queue** is a desktop component of Upland AccuRoute document management system that provides a viable digital alternative to traditional paper based document management and routing systems. It can be deployed as a standalone configuration along with the AccuRoute Acquisition Client or as a component of an enterprise edocument delivery and management system. The advantage of using AccuRoute Queue is that it processes documents in a workflow bound for a document management system (or Object Archive  $^{\text{TM}}$ ). For information on AccuRoute Queue and other AccuRoute products, see the <u>AccuRoute v6.0 documentation home page</u>.

## Working with AccuRoute Queue

The AccuRoute Queue (also referred to as IIQ) software processes scanned documents that are routed to predefined Queues as messages. The documents can be scanned into IIQ using AccuRoute's AccuRoute Acquisition Client software or from a multifunction device. The Queues are pre-configured in the Upland AccuRoute Server Administrator where the Administrator assigns access rights and permissions to predefined user Groups.

When an AccuRoute Queue operator logs into IIQ, the user has access to all scanned documents in the Queue. The user can open a new document for processing, assign deficiencies (mark them as lacking in requirement information) or route the document to a specific destination. To maintain data integrity, only one IIQ operator can view/process a document in IIQ at any given point in time. However, if a document was opened for processing and was not freed up after a specified length of time, it is automatically freed up for processing.

The IIQ operator can perform various tasks while processing messages. They can, for example:

- Route documents to a specific destination (for example, email, fax, printer or ObjectArchive).
- Assign deficiencies (note missing information and send them to users who can provide the missing value). For example, you notice a missing signature and assign an e-signature request on it and send it to the person who should be providing the e-signature.
- Merge and split documents, manually release a lock or move a document to processed depending on assigned permissions (by the Upland AccuRoute Server Administrator).



### **User Interface**

The **AccuRoute Acquisition** client user interface is composed of a top menu bar, a tool bar, an image/page number pane, a PDF viewer pane and a status bar with the folder number. Often there are several ways to access common commands, which are all described under the relevant heading. Keyboard shortcut keys, when applicable, are given in parenthesis.

#### File menu



- New (Cntl+N) opens the Properties window and enables the Scan command



### Introduction to AccuRoute Connect

**AccuRoute Connect** is an extensive and powerful application that allows AccuRoute to integrate with various external applications without any custom programming. It uses a powerful metadata gathering technique to collect metadata from the external application it integrates with. This captured metadata can be used, for example, to generate Embedded Directives and Routing Sheets. Using an Embedded Directive or a Routing Sheet, an user can route documents to repositories like MicroSoft® SharePoint® or ObjectArchive™ where the captured document is stored using the metadata values as indices.

The AccuRoute Connect Client is a separate licensed product that must be purchased before it can be installed or used. For more information on how AccuRoute Connect works and for custom integrations of AccuRoute with external applications, contact Upland AccuRoute Sales.

## Working with AccuRoute Connect

The following example will give you an idea as to how AccuRoute Connect works. In this example, an Administrator needs to integrate the AccuRoute environment with a Human Resource application. This application contains employee demographic information like employee name, date of birth, email and or fax number, social security number etc. The purpose of the integration is to collect the employee metadata and use the information to create a Routing Sheet, and then use the Routing Sheet to route documents to a repository using the metadata values as indices.

The integration is easily configured using AccuRoute Connect where the Administrator simply creates an "Appspace" for the application (with mappings for all the demographic information fields as Xmodel elements) and installs the Appspace on the AccuRoute Server.

Note An AppSpace can be thought of as a document container for RegWins. A RegWin is a set of tabs in the AppSpace that allow the Upland AccuRoute Server Administrator to associate controls on a Windows Application UI in order for the metadata to be captured.

Thereafter, whenever an user brings up the application, the user is presented an AccuRoute icon in the title bar. When the user activates the icon, AccuRoute Connect opens, presenting the user with one or several of the AccuRoute Connect options. (The list of options the user can see, will depend on his configuration).

- Create Routing Sheet
- Create Scan Reservation
- View Linked Documents
- Open in AccuRoute Desktop
- Upload Documents
- Link to Queue

As soon as the user selects the "Create Routing Sheet" option, a Routing Sheet is generated using the metadata from the current contents of the fields that are mapped as Xmodel elements.

## Description of the AccuRoute Connect features

#### □ Create Routing Sheet

When the user selects the "Create Routing Sheet" option, a Routing Sheet is automatically generated using the metadata from the current contents of the fields that are mapped in the external application. The Routing Sheet can be used for capturing and routing of documents to the final destination using the values as indices. Since the Routing Sheet is automatically generated, this process does not require any data entry on the users part. Administrators however, can configure, to prompt the user for a relevant Routing Sheet name or users can use the default name if needed.

#### ☐ Create Scan Reservation

When the user selects the "Create Scan Reservation" option, an Embedded Directive is automatically generated using the current contents of the fields that are mapped for collecting metadata. Once you save this, the Embedded Directive can be made available on a multi-function device for use.

This method of creating a scan reservation does not require any data entry on the users part. Additionally, the users do not have to save or print a Routing Sheet before walking up to a multifunction device to scan their document.

This feature provides the same basic capabilities as "Create Routing Sheet" option. However instead of generating a routing sheet, the system creates an Embedded Directive and make it available on a multi-function device.

#### ☐ View Linked Documents

This feature allows the end user in an external application to search for and view all documents previously associated with a field mapped for metadata collection. It invokes the AccuRoute Web Client's direct search capability where the mapped field is used as the search criteria for finding related documents.

For example, if the end user is in the external application selects the View linked Documents option, and if the employee id is mapped field, then the user will be able to view all documents that were archived via the AccuRoute Web Client that are associated with the employee ID.

#### ☐ Open the AccuRoute Desktop

In cases where more complicated or modified processing is required for document routing, the user will have the option to open the Routing Sheet in the AccuRoute Desktop Client.

When the user selects the "Open in AccuRoute Desktop" option in AccuRoute Connect, an Embedded Directive is created using the current contents of the fields that are mapped for metadata collection. The AccuRoute Desktop Client application opens where the newly created Embedded Directive is listed. The user can save the Embedded Directive as is, or modify the directive as needed before saving it.

The Embedded Directive can be accessed from the AccuRoute Desktop Client, the AccuRoute Web Client and also from multi function devices (MFPs). It is usually listed at the top of directives list available for use.

#### **□** Upload Documents

When the user selects this option and if the documents being captured already exist electronically, the user has the option to upload the documents directly to the Upland AccuRoute Server for processing, bypassing the scanning step.

#### ☐ Link to IIQ

The Link to Queue feature allows the user to apply the metadata from the external application to a job listed in the External Applications folder of the AccuRoute Queue application.

When the user selects the "Link to Queue" option in AccuRoute Connect, the Upland AccuRoute Workflow Integration Application page opens listing all jobs in the External Applications folder. The user can select a job, preview the associated document and click OK to apply the metadata from the external application to the job. The job moves from the External Applications folder of AccuRoute Queue application and matches the queue workflow rules to its final destination.

### Introduction to AccuRoute COM API

The **AccuRoute COM API** is a standard application program interface that enables you to customize the functionality of your Upland AccuRoute solution and integrate it with your existing technologies.

The most common questions on the AccuRoute COM API are:

- What kinds of functions does the AccuRoute COM API support? The AccuRoute COM API supports many server functions, enabling you to write applications or scripts that can connect to the message server as an administrator or user; create messages; create Embedded Directives and Routing Sheets, and associate them with messages; submit messages to the message server; create users, delegates, recipients, and attachments; and more.
- Who should use the AccuRoute COM API? Users of the AccuRoute COM API should be experienced application developers familiar with COM applications and the Upland AccuRoute Server.
- What information can I find in this documentation? This documentation contains requirements
  and installation instructions, a description of the objects and their relationships, a complete listing of
  the properties and methods for each object, information on using the Sample project, a complete list
  of error codes, examples of functions, and a list of additional resources including documentation and
  technical support.
- How do I get started? Install the AccuRoute COM API, run the modules in the Sample project, and review the code examples in this documentation.

## Working with the Upland AccuRoute Server

The Upland AccuRoute Server, the centerpiece of any AccuRoute implementation, is an enterprise document routing solution that integrates with existing mail systems; document management systems and records management systems; multifunction devices and other network hardware such as fax machines, scanners, and copiers; enterprise database applications; and other enterprise business applications. It accepts inbound messages through numerous connectors and directly from client applications, and delivers outbound messages through its connectors to recipients and destinations. All messages are subject to rules, which determine the path of each message through the server's processing components. Each message has a journal where the server enters all the actions it has taken on the message. The server maintains a set of user defaults, which are settings and permissions that apply to unknown users, and a database of registered users, which represents known users that have unique settings and permissions. Users can have delegates, assistants, and printers assigned to them, and can also be subscribed to preview, approval, or review for messages they send.

#### **Embedded Directives**

Upland AccuRoute first introduced the concept of using the Embedded Directive to route messages. The Embedded Directive, an encoded key, represents a set of routing instructions.

Embedded Directives are created using the AccuRoute COM API, the AccuRoute Client, and the Upland AccuRoute Web Client. Once users begin creating Embedded Directives, the highly intelligent Upland AccuRoute Server can apply an existing Embedded Directive to messages, scan messages to detect an Embedded Directive on a Routing Sheet, and apply user-specified Embedded Directives to messages.

When an Embedded Directive has been associated with a message, the Upland AccuRoute Server's Embedded Directive Manager component decodes the Embedded Directive and retrieves the routing instructions for the server. A single Embedded Directive can be used repeatedly to streamline common document routing practices, can be configured to expire after a particular date and time, and can be associated with individual users or a user account that a group of users can access.

### **Routing Sheets**

The Routing Sheet is a cover sheet for a message that contains an Embedded Directive. Users can scan documents with Routing Sheets, and using the AccuRoute COM API, you can create messages and attach Routing Sheets.

The Routing Sheet serves two purposes:

- It contains the Embedded Directive, the encoded key that represents the routing instructions for the message.
- It functions as a cover sheet for the message. Depending on the message settings, the Routing Sheet accompanies the message to its final destination or is removed once the server decodes the Embedded Directive on it. Routing Sheets are so versatile that even users outside your company can send documents that contain Routing Sheets to your company and know that these documents are delivered reliably to the appropriate recipients and destinations.

### **Messages**

Messages is a general term used to describe jobs on the server:

- An inbound or outbound message associated with an Embedded Directive.
  - Example of an inbound message Someone outside your company sends a message via e-mail or fax to someone inside your company. The message includes a Routing Sheet that contains an Embedded Directive. (In this instance, the server must be configured appropriately to identify inbound messages with Routing Sheet, decode the Embedded Directive, and deliver the message to the recipients and destinations indicated by the Embedded Directive.)
  - Example of an outbound message A user sends a message that includes a Routing Sheet through e-mail, a network scanner or copier, or Filescan. (In this instance, the server must be configured appropriately to identify outbound messages with Routing Sheets, decode the Embedded Directive, and deliver the message to the recipients and destinations indicated by the Embedded Directive.)
- An outbound message submitted to a connector.
  - Example A user copies a message to a Filescan folder in the local area network. The Filescan
    connector on the server retrieves the message. Then the Upland AccuRoute Server prepares and
    delivers the message according to the routing instructions in the control file. (In this instance, the
    server must be configured appropriately to process messages through Filescan.)

#### An inbound or outbound fax.

- Example of an inbound fax Someone outside your company sends a fax to someone inside your company. The server, in a typical configuration, queries your company's address book using the DID number or DTMF digits associated with the inbound fax, obtains the e-mail address of the recipient, and routes the fax to the recipient. (In this instance, the server must be configured appropriately to process and deliver inbound faxes.)
- Example of an outbound fax A user sends a fax to someone outside your company. The server
  prepares the message and routes it to the Telco connector. Then the Modem Server manages the
  delivery of the fax. (In this instance, the server must be configured appropriately to process and
  deliver outbound faxes.)

## AccuRoute COM API objects

The AccuRoute COM API supports the following objects:

- **EmbeddedDirective** object Represents an embedded directive. (An embedded directive is an encoded key that represents a set of routing instructions.)
- EmbeddedDirectiveTemplate object Represents a routing sheet template.
- Message object Represents a message on the Upland AccuRoute Server. (A message has at least one recipient or destination and at least one attachment.)
- MessageAttachment object Represents a file attachment to a message.
- MessageRecipient object Represents the recipient or destination of a message.
- MessageServer object Represents the message server.
- **RecipientJournal** object Represents the message journal. (The message journal is a log of events pertaining to the message; each time the server acts on a message, it adds an event to the journal and indicates whether the action was successful. If the action failed, the description of the event usually indicates the reason for the failure.)
- **ServConnect** object Represents a connection to the message server.
- **User** object Represents a user within your organization.
- **UserDelegate** object Represents a delegate. A delegate is a user who can manage the messages of another user, and/or send messages on behalf of another user.




Figure 2-2: AccuRoute COM API objects and their relationships

# Introduction to AccuRoute CostRecovery

**AccuRoute CostRecovery** is a stand-alone application for AccuRoute that extracts information from Upland AccuRoute Server applications for billing purposes. AccuRoute CostRecovery creates a file that contains the information extracted from the Upland AccuRoute Server database. You can post this file to your billing system, which enables your company to bill the appropriate client for message transactions such as copying or scanning documents, if your company uses AccuRoute CostRecovery with AccuRoute.

#### Note

This manual includes information about using AccuRoute CostRecovery with AccuRoute. When you install AccuRoute CostRecovery, it is customized with information specific to the Upland AccuRoute Server application you use. For this reason, some of the images of AccuRoute CostRecovery screens displayed in this manual will not necessarily exactly match what you see when you run AccuRoute CostRecovery. The appropriate Upland AccuRoute Server-specific images or procedures are provided where necessary to enhance your understanding of the program.

AccuRoute CostRecovery and AccuRoute integrate with Xerox® Office Software. This enables users to scan paper documents to a computer network and route them to one or more destinations. A user creates a cover sheet that contains sender information, recipient information, and instructions. From a Xerox Document Centre, the user scans the cover sheet along with a paper document to the Xerox FlowPort server. Following the instructions on the cover sheet, FlowPort software routes the document to designated locations on the server. AccuRoute server software then processes and forwards the document to one or more of the following destinations: an e-mail service or a document management system.

For more information about any of these messaging solutions, contact Upland AccuRoute or refer to the documentation that accompanied the product you are using with AccuRoute CostRecovery.

### CostRecovery Features

AccuRoute CostRecovery features include:

- The ability to collect message or document transactions from the message database in AccuRoute.
- Customizable templates to design the format of the extracted information to meet the needs of your billing system.
- The ability to price by page for faxes and e-mail messages, and to assign different prices for the first page and all additional pages, and to add a maximum price for any given message.
- The ability to price local, long distance, and international calls differently, and to assign a maximum cost for each type of call.
- The ability to price by page for copies, scanned documents, and storage of documents in a document management system with AccuRoute.

- The ability to schedule AccuRoute CostRecovery to run automatically on a daily basis.
- The ability to parse partial strings from billing codes and to remove leading zeros from numeric billing codes.

### Introduction to AccuRoute Server Monitor

**AccuRoute Server Monitor** is a stand-alone application that monitors various components of an Upland AccuRoute Server. It executes custom-created tests to detect workflow bottlenecks and system failures.

Conditions that can be monitored include the size of the message database, available disk space on the AccuRoute Server, the size of Send and Receive folders, the status of AccuRoute services, and the status of connectors. Additionally, with its versatile monitoring capabilities, AccuRoute Server Monitor runs test in specified frequencies; maintains a suspend schedule; supports custom actions for each test which can include sending e-mail notifications, writing entries to the event log, and changing the status of AccuRoute services; supports custom e-mail addresses for the source and destination of notification messages; and monitors Upland AccuRoute Server clusters.

AccuRoute Server Monitor consists of:

- AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator A snap-in to the Microsoft Management Console, the Administrator plays two essential roles. First, it serves as the user interface where you create "tests" for each Upland AccuRoute Server you monitor. (Each test consists of criteria and at least one action.) Second, the Administrator connects to the AccuRoute Server Monitor Service. Because the AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator can run on a different system than the AccuRoute Server Monitor Service, you can manage your server monitoring methods from another Windows system in the local area network, including your desktop.
- AccuRoute Server Monitor Service This Windows service performs all monitoring activities
  from a high-availability server. It logs on to the Upland AccuRoute Server using the Upland AccuRoute
  Server account, which has DCOM access and launch permissions on the Upland AccuRoute Server,
  and then executes the tests created in the Administrator.

### Introduction to AccuRoute FaxCenter

**FaxCenter** is a fax routing application. While many inbound faxes will be routed directly to recipients in your company, there are instances when someone needs to review an inbound fax, determine its most appropriate recipient or destination, and send the fax to that recipient or destination. FaxCenter offers this ability.

The FaxCenter and server routing rules help you to set up an inbound routing rule that determines which faxes need to be reviewed and routed to the appropriate recipients and destinations. When these inbound faxes arrive at the server, they are routed to FaxCenter users. FaxCenter users determine the most appropriate recipients and destinations for each fax and route faxes accordingly.

As you follow the procedures in this guide, you will:

- Install FaxCenter on client systems.
- Add FaxCenter users to Registered Users in the Administrator and give them permissions to run FaxCenter and use the appropriate features.
- Set up inbound routing rules on the server that determine which faxes get routed to FaxCenter.

Once you have completed these steps, FaxCenter users can route faxes to e-mail recipients, fax machines, network printers, and document management systems. They may also be able to release outbound faxes in Registration Pending to secure destinations.



# AccuRoute Web Apps user requirements for email account

The Web Apps Client users must have an email account created for them using the mail server (Microsoft Exchange Server).

Important The mail server for any email account created must be installed on the same domain on which the AccuRoute server is installed.

This is necessary because the Web Apps Client queries the Active Directory attributes like "mail" and "proxyAddresses". The "proxyAddresses attribute is added to the Active Directory properties only if an Microsoft Exchange Server is installed in the same domain as the Active Directory.

# AccuRoute Web Apps user full permission requirements

**Important** 

Full permissions to the Web Apps installation folder is required for all domain users (including the application pool account user) when Web Apps is installed to a non-default location with a custom virtual directory name.

The **AccuRoute Desktop** setup installs the AccuRoute **Desktop Client** and the **Watch Folder** application. The installation will set the Watch Folder application to start on Windows startup, and will automatically start when installation is complete.


### Installing AccuRoute Desktop

Note

If your AccuRoute Client version is older than v5.0, it is removed and AccuRoute Desktop v6.0 is installed when you run the setup. You can install the AccuRoute Desktop on the AccuRoute Server or the client system. In previous versions, the install created a Post Script printer that was used to convert the printed document to PDF. In this version, the install will no longer create a printer. All printing will go through the Print to AccuRoute client, which can be found on the AccuRoute server system\ clients directory.

#### To install AccuRoute Desktop:

- I Log on to the system using an account that belongs to the local Administrators group.
- 2 Navigate to the Clients directory containing the setup files.
- 3 Click setup.exe. The InstallShield wizard configures your system and the **Welcome** message appears.




4 Click **Next**. The **License Agreement** screen appears.




5 Read the agreement carefully and if you agree to the terms, click Yes.

6 To accept the default, click **Next**. Otherwise, click **Change**. If you want to install in a non-default location, click **Browse** and then select a location. Then click **Next**.




7 The Ready to Install the Program screen opens.

(These views are reserved for special applications, such as the Send To AccuRoute Desktop feature and printing to AccuRoute Desktop and are not designed for general purposes.)

The following view files are installed on the AccuRoute server and reside in ...\AccuRoute\AccuRouteViews:

Default.VIEW - View that AccuRoute Desktop loads on startup in standard mode.

Do not delete, rename, or move this file. It is required for AccuRoute Desktop to work **Important** correctly.


- DirectSend.OMV View that AccuRoute Desktop loads when the user sends a document to AccuRoute Desktop using the Send To AccuRoute Desktop shortcut in Windows.
- Print To.OMV View that can be optionally used when a user prints a document to the AccuRoute Desktop, By default when printing to the AccuRoute Desktop, the default view is used.
- AccuRoute Client-Safe.OMV Backup copy of Default.VIEW. Do not modify this file.

## About the AccuRoute Server Monitor client components

AccuRoute Server Monitor is installed with two components: AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator and AccuRoute Server Monitor service. The Server Monitor service is a Windows service that monitors the AccuRoute Server environment and is installed only on one system. The Server Monitor Administrator can be installed on multiple systems so that one or more administrators can conveniently manage the AccuRoute Server Monitor.

> AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator and AccuRoute Server Administrator are snap-ins to the Microsoft Management Console. Both snap-ins are supported on the same system so that administrators can manage the AccuRoute Server and the application that monitors it from the same location.

## Installing AccuRoute Server Monitor

The AccuRoute Server Monitor setup files are installed on the AccuRoute Server in a folder that is not shared by default. Before installing Server Monitor, log on to the AccuRoute Server using an account that belongs to the local Administrators group, share C:\Program Files\Upland

AccuRoute\AccuRoute\Clients\AccuRouteServerMonitor, and give the Server Monitor installation user read access to the share the path.

### To install AccuRoute Server Monitor:



## Configuring server-client connectivity for AccuRoute Desktop

AccuRoute Desktop supports multiple server-client connectivity methods. Choose an appropriate method for the target environment and then complete the required configuration.

### About connecting with the AccuRoute Server

AccuRoute Desktop supports the following methods of server-client connectivity:

- DCOM
- HTTP
- Secure HTTP

At the beginning of a session, AccuRoute Desktop establishes a connection to the AccuRoute Server—either by connecting directly using DCOM or submitting the request to AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client. The initial connection validates the user's permissions to run AccuRoute Desktop and solicits a response from the AccuRoute Server.

Note AccuRoute Desktop does not maintain a constant connection to the AccuRoute Server during a session. Instead, AccuRoute Desktop requests and submits data to the AccuRoute Server on demand.

For example, when the user tries to open an Embedded Directive, AccuRoute Desktop requests a list of the user's Embedded Directives from the AccuRoute Server.

This connectivity behavior brings an added benefit to environments with an AccuRoute Server cluster. AccuRoute Desktop can continue a session even when the AccuRoute Server cluster enters a failover state and the alternative AccuRoute Server becomes active. Although a momentary delay can occur during the failover transition, AccuRoute Desktop establishes a connection to whichever AccuRoute Server is active.

On startup, AccuRoute Desktop reads the connection string and analyzes the first 5 characters. (The connection string is either preconfigured in AccuRouteClient.XML or entered in the Connect To Server dialog box.)

- If the first 5 characters of the connection string are http:, AccuRoute Desktop uses HTTP connectivity.
- If the first 5 characters of the connection string are https, AccuRoute Desktop uses Secure HTTP connectivity.
- For all other values, AccuRoute Desktop uses DCOM connectivity.

Note For HTTP or secure HTTP connectivity, AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client is required. Additionally, if the environment has an AccuRoute Server cluster, then AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client must be configured to support an AccuRoute Server cluster. For more information, consult the AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client chapter of the AccuRoute Server Installation and Configuration Guide.

### **Configuring server-client connectivity methods**

To configure server-client connectivity, follow the instructions for the appropriate connectivity method:

- DCOM The DCOM connectivity method facilitates a direct connection between AccuRoute Desktop and the AccuRoute Server.
- HTTP The HTTP connectivity method facilitates a connection between AccuRoute Desktop and AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client on the web server. (AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client is a web service extension that handles requests for AccuRoute Desktop and the AccuRoute Server).
- <u>Secure HTTP</u> -The secure HTTP connectivity method facilitates a secure connection between AccuRoute Desktop and AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client on the web server. (AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client is a web service extension that handles requests for AccuRoute Desktop and the AccuRoute Server.)

#### **DCOM**

The DCOM configuration on the client running AccuRoute Desktop must give access permissions to the AccuRoute Server account.

### To configure DCOM permissions on Windows 2016 and on Windows 2012:

- I Log in to the system where you will install AccuRoute Server using the login credentials of the local Administrators group.
- 2 Click **Start** and select **Run**. Enter dcomcnfg and click **OK**. The **Component Services** snap-in opens.
- 3 Expand Component Services > Computers. Right-click My Computer and select Properties from the menu options.
- 4 Click the **COM Security** tab.
- 5 Under Launch and Activation Permissions, click the Edit Limits button, and then click the Add button.
- 6 Add Anonymous Logon in the Permissions list, select the Allow check box to allow the Local Launch permission, Local Activation permission, Remote Launch permission, and Remote Activation permission for the selected group.
- 7 Click OK twice to save changes.
- 8 Restart the system for these configuration changes to take effect.

### **HTTP**

HTTP connectivity requires AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client. For more information, consult the AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client section in the AccuRoute Server Installation Guide. No additional client configuration is required.

#### **Secure HTTP**

Secure HTTP connectivity requires AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client, and it must be configured to accept secure HTTP requests. For more information, consult the AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client section in the AccuRoute Server Installation Guide. No additional client configuration is required.

### Implementing connectivity methods

On startup, AccuRoute Desktop must be able to establish a connection to the AccuRoute Server. This requires a connection string which represents either the location of the AccuRoute Server (DCOM connectivity) or the web address of the virtual directory where AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client is installed (HTTP and secure HTTP connectivity).

To establish a connection to the AccuRoute Server, AccuRoute Desktop does one of the following:

- Reads the connection string in AccuRouteClient.XML and connects to the AccuRoute Server automatically.
- Reads all connection strings in AccuRouteClient.XML and prompts the user select a connection string. By default, the user can also enter a connection string manually.

Because AccuRoute Desktop can be customized for users and groups, both scenarios can occur in the same environment. Both methods require implementation. For more information, see

- Entering the connection string manually during login (5-5)
- Preconfiguring AccuRoute Desktop with the connection string (5-5)

### Entering the connection string manually during login

When logging in to AccuRoute Desktop, the user can enter the connection string manually. It must be formatted appropriately for the connectivity method being used.

### Preconfiguring AccuRoute Desktop with the connection string

The AccuRoute Desktop configuration file, AccuRouteClient.XML, can be configured with the connection string so that AccuRoute Desktop automatically displays the connection string in the server menu or connects to the AccuRoute Server immediately.

Upland AccuRoute strongly recommends this configuration. It can eliminate or reduce issues that can occur when users do not format the connection string correctly.

### To configure AccuRoute Desktop to connect to the AccuRoute Server automatically:

Go to <u>Section 9: Frequently Asked Questions</u> and see <u>Can the client connect automatically without prompting the user on startup?</u> (9-4).

### To configure AccuRoute Desktop to display the connection string in the server menu:

Locate AccuRouteClient.XML on the client on the AccuRoute Server located in ...\Upland AccuRoute\AccuRoute\Clients\AccuRoute Desktop.

If any modifications are made to the AccuRoute Desktop setup on the AccuRoute Server and the environment has Server cluster, AccuRoute strongly recommends repeating this procedure on the alternative AccuRoute Server.

- 2 Open the file in Notepad or in an XML editor.
- **3** Go to the **Servers** section. (Search on Servers if necessary.)
- 4 Add the following lines:

The attribute **default** determines whether the connection string is selected by default in the login dialog box:

- If **true**, then the connection string is selected by default in the server menu.
- If **false** or omitted, then the connection string is listed in the server menu. The list order follows the same order the servers are listed here in the configuration file. If only one server is listed, then the connection string is selected by default in the server menu.

For more information on setting a default server, go to <u>Servers</u> (6-8).

- Verify that the connection string is formatted correctly. (Go to <u>Table 5-1: Connection string formats for DCOM, HTTP, and secure HTTP connectivity</u> on 5-5.)
- **6** Save the file and close it.
- 7 Start AccuRoute Desktop and verify that it is configured correctly.

## Configuring Group permissions for AccuRoute Desktop

Users must have permissions to use AccuRoute Desktop. Permissions, which are set in the **Configuration > Groups** node in the AccuRoute Server Administrator.


### To configure AccuRoute Desktop permissions:

- I Start the AccuRoute Server Administrator.
- 2 Expand the console tree and go to Configuration > Groups.
- 3 Double click the **Default** group and to any other group (you created) that should have permission to AccuRoute Desktop. The Group properties page opens.

**Note** The Group Default is created when you install AccuRoute Server. The members associated with the Default Group are Domain Users.

- 4 Click the **AccuRoute** tab to open the AccuRoute page.
- 5 Check the box beside Enable members of this group as AccuRoute users.
- 6 In the Allow group to Route to section, select the recipient types to whom messages can be routed

### from AccuRoute Desktop.



7 Click **OK** to save your changes and close the Properties page.

Tip Permissions determine whether users can run AccuRoute Desktop and which routing destination are available to them. Access to other features is controlled through views.

For environments with an Server cluster, it is not necessary to repeat these procedures on the alternate Server. This information is stored in the AccuRoute Server database which is shared by both AccuRoute Servers in the cluster.

## **Enabling integrated Windows authentication**

The AccuRoute Web Apps Client authenticates users based on their Windows logon credentials. The logon credentials are either passed transparently from the client to the web server or entered manually by the user at the beginning of each session. The login method depends on how authentication is configured.

**Note** Windows authentication is required with NTLM authentication. Skip this section for database authentication.

Windows integrated authentication is automatically configured on the AccuRoute web server during the installation process.

However, you will need to configure the Internet Explorer for authentication on clients, as described below.

# Configuring integrated Windows authentication on clients running Internet Explorer I I

You must configure Integrated Windows Authentication on all clients running Internet Explorer 11.

- Log on to the client using an account that belongs to the local Administrators group and start Internet Explorer.
- 2 Open Internet Explorer and click **Tools > Internet Options**.
- 3 Click the **Security** option.
- 4 Select Internet or Local Intranet depending on your default zone, and click Custom level.
- 5 The **Security Settings** page opens.
- **6** Scroll down to the **User Authentication** section and make the following changes:
  - To authenticate the Windows user transparently, select Automatic logon with current user name and password.
  - > To prompt the Windows user to enter logon credentials at the beginning of each session, select **Prompt for Username and Password**.
- 7 Click **OK** to close the **Internet Options** page.
- 8 Close the Internet Explorer browser.

**9** Close all other open instances of Internet Explorer for the change to take effects.

# Adding the Web Apps Client URL to the list of trusted sites on a client system

You must add the Web Apps Client URL to the list of trusted sites on all client systems which will browse to the Web Apps Client.

- Log on to the client system using an account that belongs to the local Administrators group and open Internet Options. (It is accessible from the Control Panel or Internet Explorer.)
- 2 Go to the **Security** tab.
- 3 Select Trusted sites and click Sites.
- 4 Enter the Web Apps Client URL and click Add.
- 5 Deselect Require server verification (https:) for all sites in this zone if this option is selected.
- 6 Click Close to close the Trusted Sites dialog.
- 7 Click **Apply** to save the changes and click **OK** to close the dialog box.

The Web Apps Client URL is now added to the list of trusted sites. To verify that the system recognizes the Web Apps URL as a trusted site, start Internet Explorer and go to the Web Apps URL. Verify that Web Apps Client loads. (Depending on your Windows Integrated Authentication configuration, you may need to login.

## Disabling Compatibility Mode in Internet Explorer 11

Using the AccuRoute Web Apps Client with Microsoft Internet Explorer 11 requires that you disable Compatibility Mode.

If you try to launch the Web Apps Client when the server name is included in the URL (for example: http://servername/accuroute) and Compatibility Mode enabled, the following warning message appears:

Oops. This browser is not supported (this may be resolvable by disabling Compatibility View or this site).

To disable Compatibility Mode:

- I In the Internet Explorer II browser, click the **Tools** button.
- 2 Select Compatibility View Settings.
- 3 De-select the **Display intranet sites in Compatibility View** option.

You can now successfully launch the Web Apps Client on the Internet Explorer 11 browser using the server name in the URL.

## Selecting a network printer

Be sure the printer driver is installed on the AccuRoute server. The Web Apps Client will read the list of configured network printers on the AccuRoute server.

Note Before the network printers are listed in the AccuRoute Web Apps Client, the network printers must be

## Configuring the Property Expression feature

The Property Expressions feature allows jobs to be processed based on the value of a property. For example, based on a property expression, the Administrator can configure jobs to be released from AccuRoute Queue.

### To configure Property Expression for AccuRoute Queue:

- I Click Start >All Programs > Upland AccuRoute > AccuRoute Server Administrator.
- 2 In the console tree, expand the AccuRoute Server.
- 3 Go to the Queues node and select the queue to configure. Open the properties page for the Queue.
- 4 Open the WorkFlow tab.
- 5 Add a workflow where the job will be automatically routed if a property (say for example client value) is equal to a specific value (for example, say 1111).

Important You must use double quotes not single quotes when configuring the property value, for example: \*\\prDMSCustomFields(prDMSFieldName=client)\\prDMSFieldValue="III"

6 Save the workflow.

Now when a user selects a job and applied the value of "IIII" to the job, it is automatically routed.



## Configuring the AccuRoute Connect node

After the AccuRoute Server Administrator has set permissions for the Active Directory groups, the Administrator must configure the AccuRoute Connect node.

### To go to the AccuRoute Connect node:

- I Open the AccuRoute Server Administrator console.
- 2 Expand the Configuration node and find the AccuRoute Connect node.




The AccuRoute Connect node lists all Appspaces defined for the AccuRoute environment. For each Appspace, the Administrator will define the Xmodel elements.


Note AppSpace can be thought of as a document container for RegWins. A RegWin is a set of tabs in the AppSpace that allow the AccuRoute Server Administrator to associate controls on a Windows Application UI in order for the metadata to be captured.

The Appspace and the associated Xmodel definitions will depend on the external application AccuRoute is integrating with

The following example shows an Appspace that has been defined for integration with a Human Resource application processing employee demographic information.



To collect employee demographic information like primary identification number, employee display name, email, phone and or fax number, the AccuRoute Server Administrator will define Xmodel elements for each individual information piece as shown below.



Since the AccuRoute action will populate properties from only one X-Model, when mapping properties to X-Model elements, it is important to create all the elements in one X-Model.


For example, the MyCRM. Appspace that is included with the install and is located in the Samples directory has several X-Models in each Regwin. This means that not all the fields are accessible through the AccuRoute action.

  - a Click Properties and in the Action Properties page that opens, go to the Options tab.
  - **b** Click on the **Browse** button beside the **and** field and select from available Embedded Directives





- c Optionally, in the **Name** text box, provide a descriptive name for the Embedded Directive. You can also ask the user to provide a name by checking the Prompt the user to enter name option.
- d To enable use of Prompts, select the **Prompt user to enter name** option.
- e Click **OK** to save your changes.
- 10 If you are configuring use of the Link to Queue feature, specify the Application Code using the following instructions.
  - a In the **Properties** page, select **LinkTollQ** and then click **Properties** in that page. The **Action Properties** page opens.
  - **b** Open the **Actions** tab.
  - c In the **Application Code** text box, enter **IIC**.
  - d Click **OK** to save your changes.

## Configuring AccuRoute Server Monitor server properties

After you add an AccuRoute Server to the Server Monitor Administrator, right-click the server (or, highlight the server and click **Action** on the toolbar) to open the available options menu.


The available options are:

Properties - Select this menu item to configure options on the General and Suspend Monitor tabs.

Remove - Select this menu item to remove the server from the Server Monitor Administrator.

New - Select this menu item to create a new test.

## Clustering Server Monitor

When adding a clustered server to the Server Monitor Administrator, it must be active. The server icon in the AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator changes when you add a clustered server.

If you are using a clustered server environment, please consider the following while configuring AccuRoute Server Monitor:


- You need to cluster a server before you add it to the Server Monitor Administrator.
- Make sure you add the preferred server in the cluster to the Server Monitor Administrator.

- If the failover time in a clustered environment exceeds 90 seconds, AccuRoute Server Monitor
  performs all actions specified in the Cluster Failover Action option located on the General tab of the
  server properties. It also performs all these actions if both the preferred and secondary servers are
  shut down.
- After control is moved from the preferred server to the secondary server, the test will be performed for the backup server, but the stored configurations are not updated with the backup server name.

## Defining sender and recipient e-mail addresses


When you add a server to the Server Monitor Administrator, you are prompted to enter two e-mail addresses in the **Default Test Criteria** screen.

Figure 5-2: Default Test Criteria screen



The e-mail address in the **From** field is used as the default sender's e-mail address whenever you add a new e-mail action for your test criteria.

The e-mail address in the **To** field is used as the default recipient's e-mail address whenever you add a new e-mail action for your test criteria.



You can update the e-mail addresses in the server properties at any time, as well as override the default e-mail addresses when creating new test criteria.

## Defining server properties - the General tab


The General tab is where you define server properties in the AccuRoute Server Monitor.

### Opening the General tab

Use the following procedure to open the General tab.

### To open the General tab in the server properties:

Right-click the server and select **Properties**. (Or, highlight the server, click **Action** on the toolbar, and select **Properties**.) The **General** tab is selected by default.



### On this tab, you can:

- Enable or disable monitoring of this server by selecting or clearing **Enable monitoring of this** server. The icon displayed in the Server Monitor Administrator changes based on your selection.
- Change the sender and recipient e-mail addresses. You defined these e-mail addresses when you added the server to the Server Monitor Administrator.
- Define actions for when a failover occurs.
  - Tip You can enter multiple e-mail addresses in the To field by separating each e-mail address with a semicolon (;), or you can enter a distribution list address. Distribution list aliases are not supported.

### Defining failover actions

In a clustered environment, you can define the actions that happen when a failover event occurs in the cluster. For example, you can define a Failover Action that sends an e-mail if the secondary server takes over from the preferred server.

### To define Failover Actions:

- I Click **Failover Action** on the Server Properties General tab. The Cluster Failover Action screen appears.
- 2 Specify the actions to take when a failover occurs.
  - Complete the wizard for the action you specified.

## Creating routing rules for inbound faxes

Using the following procedure, you will create an inbound routing rule that determines the faxes that should be routed to FaxCenter users. Once the server routes these faxes to FaxCenter. FaxCenter users will review each fax, determine the most appropriate recipients and destinations for the fax, and route the fax accordingly.

### To create a rule for routing inbound faxes to FaxCenter:

- I Double-click **Rules** in the console tree.
- 2 Right-click **Inbound** and select **New | Rule**. The **Specify the Criteria for this Rule** screen appears.
- 3 Click the **Add** button, select a criterion for inbound faxes that should match this rule, and click **Next**.
- 4 Specify the parameters for the criterion you selected in the previous step and click Finish.
- 5 Add more criteria for inbound faxes that should match this rule, if needed, and click **Next**. The **Specify the Actions to take for this Rule** screen appears.
- 6 Click Add. The Add Rule Action screen appears.
- 7 Select FaxCenter and click Next. The Route to FaxCenter screen appears.
- 8 Select the **FaxCenter user** option only if you want the inbound faxes that match this rule to be routed to a particular FaxCenter user, and then select the FaxCenter user from the drop-down list. (If you do not select this option, inbound faxes that match this rule will be routed to all FaxCenter users.)

Type the number of hours a fax can reside in FaxCenter in the **Expiration Time** spin box. (If a fax has not been routed to a recipient or other destination within the allotted time, the server fails the fax and removes it from FaxCenter.)

### Click Finish.

- **9** Add any other actions for inbound faxes that match this rule, if needed, and click **Next**. The If any Action(s) fail do the following screen appears.
- 10 Add the actions you want to apply to faxes that match this rule if any of the primary actions fail (optional), and click **Next**. The **Specify a name for this rule** screen appears.
- II Type a friendly name for the rule in the text box, and configure the other options in this screen as needed, and click **Finish**. The new rule wizard creates the rule and displays all the inbound routing rules.

Now that you have created an inbound routing rule for FaxCenter, order the inbound routing rules as needed.

# Configuring address book integration in the AccuRoute Desktop setup

Address book integration in AccuRoute Desktop enables users to add message recipients from the same address book they use to send email messages. Because AccuRoute Desktop supports all contacts in the address book, including global and personal contacts, users can quickly access all the message recipients they can access from their email application. Supported email applications include:

- Outlook
- Notes
- GroupWise

The address book configuration is stored on the client, so AccuRoute Desktop can be configured to support different address books on different clients. However, each installation of AccuRoute Desktop supports only one address book: Outlook, Notes, or GroupWise. Address book integration can also be disabled.

Upland AccuRoute recommends configuring address book integration in the AccuRoute Desktop setup on the AccuRoute Server. This ensures that no configuration is required on the client after AccuRoute Desktop is installed.

By default, AccuRoute Desktop is configured to support the Outlook address book. If the default configuration is correct, skip this procedure.

Tip The address book configuration is stored in AccuRouteclient.xml. There are additional properties in this file that can be modified before AccuRoute Desktop is installed on the client.

### To configure address book integration in the AccuRoute Desktop setup:

- Log on to the system running the AccuRoute Server. Navigate to ...\Upland AccuRoute\AccuRoute\Clients\AccuRouteDesktop\program files\AccuRoute\AccuRouteDesktop.
- 2 Open AccuRouteclient.xml in Notepad or an XML editor.
- 3 Go to prMailType and modify the value of this property using one of the following values:
  - Outlook (default)
  - LotusNotes
  - Groupwise
  - None

**Note** None disables address book integration. When address book integration is disabled, the user must enter the destination address of all recipients manually.

4 Save your changes and close the file.

## To configure address book integration in the system running AccuRoute Desktop

- Log on to the system running the AccuRoute Server. Copy the updated file AccuRouteclient.xml from ...\UplandAccuRoute\AccuRoute\Clients\AccuRouteDesktop\program files\AccuRoute\AccuRouteDesktop
- Now go to the client system where AccuRoute Desktop is already installed. Paste the file in ...\AccuRoute\AccuRouteDesktop and replace the existing file.

**Important** 

For environments with an AccuRoute Server cluster, AccuRoute strongly recommends repeating this procedure on the alternate AccuRoute Server.

# Using AccuRoute Desktop with an AccuRoute Connector for DMS

AccuRoute Desktop can be configured to integrate with document management systems and other specialized applications that extend the functionality of pre-existing document storage and retrieval methods. For more information on configuring DMS connectors, consult the AccuRoute DMS Libraries documentation. For general information on AccuRoute Connectors for DMSs, contact AccuRoute Sales.

# Configuring MyAccuRoute on the AccuRoute Server

The MyAccuRoute feature streamlines a workflow; it enables the AccuRoute Server to process all messages from the same user with the same Embedded Directive. For example, suppose a user is responsible for scanning hard copy documents at a scanning station and routing them all to the location where another user indexes and archives those documents. When MyAccuRoute is configured for the user, the AccuRoute Server always applies the Embedded Directive specified in the user's My AccuRoute configuration, which in turn specifies the destination to which to route the scanned documents.

The key aspect of this configuration is that the AccuRoute Server must be able to identify the sender so that it can apply the Embedded Directive that is selected in the user's MyAccuRoute configuration. The previous example that describes a user at a scanning station presumes that the user logs in to the scanning station and that this data accompanies the scan to the AccuRoute Server. There are other scenarios in which the user might be submitting messages repeatedly from AccuRoute Desktop.

Tip AccuRoute offers customized solutions for some device manufacturers including Xerox, HP, Sharp and Ricoh. Contact AccuRoute Sales for more information.

The configuration that supports MyAccuRoute has two required components:

- MyAccuRoute configuration on the client The user must create an Embedded Directive and select it in the My AccuRoute configuration in AccuRoute Desktop. For more information, consult the AccuRoute Desktop User Guide.
- Outbound rule on the AccuRoute Server An outbound rule must identify the criteria for the
  message, for example, the sender, and set the action so that the AccuRoute Server processes the
  message using MyAccuRoute.

MyAccuRoute is configured on the AccuRoute Server. Notify users that they must configure MyAccuRoute before they can begin using this feature. By default, an outbound rule already exists on the server.

For environments with an AccuRoute Server cluster, it is not necessary to repeat this procedure on the alternate AccuRoute Server. This information is stored in the AccuRoute Server database which is shared by both AccuRoute Servers in the cluster.

# Configuring the Watch Folders application on the AccuRoute Server

Watch Folders is a desktop application installed with AccuRoute Desktop. A watch folder is:

- an ordinary folder residing on the client system running AccuRoute Desktop
- has been identified in AccuRoute Desktop as a "watch folder"
- has been associated with an Embedded Directive

In AccuRoute Desktop v6.0, the Watch Folders have been modified to support the following categories:

- Deliver to ED
- Deliver to Recipient (DMS only supported in this release)
- Launch AccuRoute Desktop

You can also configure the Watch Folder tray application to start at Windows starts up. It uses Virtual Filescan implementation and gathers files that are dropped in known/specified folders and then process them through the AccuRoute Server.

When the AccuRoute Desktop user wants to send a message using the Embedded Directive that has been associated with the watch folder, the user copies files to the watch folder, and AccuRoute Desktop processes those files as a message. In this way, the watch folder functions as an automatic sending queue. Similarly, when the user wants to deliver a message to a DMS, the user copies the file to the designated watch folder from where it is picked up and processed by the server and routes to the DMS.

## **Advantage of using Watch Folders**

When the AccuRoute Desktop user wants to send a message using the Embedded Directive or a specific folder associated as a watch folder, the user copies files to the watch folder. AccuRoute Desktop processes those files as a message and sends them to the AccuRoute Server for further processing. In this way, the watch folder functions as an automatic sending queue.

The biggest advantage to using the Watch Folders therefore is that they enables users to streamline their most common workflows. Consider the following example. An executive assistant sends out a packet of materials each week to a group of people who meet weekly to discuss operations.

The executive assistant simply gathers the files that should be distributed to group members and copies them to the watch folder that was set up for this purpose. AccuRoute Desktop immediately processes the files in the folder as a single message and distributes those files using the Embedded Directive that is associated with the watch folder.

The configuration supporting the Watch Folders requires two components:

- Watch Folders configuration on the AccuRoute Desktop client The user must configure the Watch Folders application and identify the local folders that should be designated as watch folders. For more information consult the AccuRoute Desktop user guide.
- Outbound rule configuration on the AccuRoute Server An outbound rule must identify
  outbound messages with an Embedded Directive and allow the Embedded Directive Manager
  component to process these messages using the Embedded Directive specified in the user's Watch
  Folders configuration.

## To create an outbound rule on the AccuRoute Server for the Watch Folders application:

- I Start the AccuRoute Server Administrator.
- 2 Expand Rules in the console tree.
- 3 Right-click **Outbound** and select **New > Rule**. The rules wizard appears on the desktop.
- 4 Click the **Add** in the **Specify the Criteria for this Rule** window. Select **Embedded Directive** in the list of criteria and click **Next**. Select **is**, enter \*, and click **Add**. Click **Finish**. The criteria **Where Embedded Directive is** \* appears in the list. Click **Next**.
- 5 Click the Add in the Specify the Actions to take for this Rule window. Select Route to Embedded Directive Manager and click Next. Select Use sender-specified Embedded Directive and click Finish. The action Use the Embedded Directive Manager to determine actions appears in the list. Click Next.
- 6 Click Next in the If any Action(s) fail do the following window.
- 7 Verify that **Stop processing other rules** is selected and click **Finish**.

Note This rule identifies all outbound messages with an Embedded Directive. If the AccuRoute Server has more than one rule that identifies messages with an Embedded Directive, review the list of rules and verify that the rule order produces the correct results.

The Watch Folders application is configured on the AccuRoute Server. Notify users that they must configure the Watch Folders application before they can begin using this feature.

For environments with an AccuRoute Server cluster, it is not necessary to repeat this procedure on the alternate AccuRoute Server. This information is stored in the AccuRoute Server database which is shared by both AccuRoute Servers in the cluster.

# Modifying the AccuRoute Desktop configuration file

The AccuRoute Desktop configuration file, AccuRouteclient.xml, provides configuration data to AccuRoute Desktop on startup. The configuration data includes the name of the view that AccuRoute Desktop loads on startup in standard mode, the email application that provides address book support to AccuRoute Desktop, the search folders that contain view files and Routing Sheet template files, and the AccuRoute Server in the network.

AccuRouteclient.xml can be modified before or after AccuRoute Desktop is installed on the client. If AccuRouteclient.xml is modified after AccuRoute Desktop is installed on the client, push the file out to ...\AccuRoute\AccuRouteDesktop on the client and replace the existing file.

Modify AccuRouteclient.xml using the guidelines in the following table. The major sections of the file appear

in bold typeface.

# Configuring required COM permissions for launching the remote Web Apps

If your Web Apps Client is installed on a remote system (separate from that of the AccuRoute Server), you must configure COM permissions for Anonymous\_logon on the AccuRoute server.

#### To do so:


- I Log in to the system running the AccuRoute server using an account that belongs to the Administrator.
- 2 Click Start > Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Component Services.
- 3 In the console, expand Component Services > Computers.
- 4 Right-click My Computer and select Properties from the drop-down menu.
- 5 Click COM Security.
- 6 In the Access Permissions section, click Edit Limits. The Access Permission page opens.
- 7 For user Anonymous\_logon, select Local Access and Remote Access permissions.
- 8 Click **OK** to close the page.







- 6 In the **Features** tab, click **Add** and select any Feature you want to associate with the Profile. Options include: **DocumentLink**, **Favorites**, **PrintToWeb**, **ScanToWeb**, and **SendToWeb**.



7 As it does with Applications, a **Properties** screen appears for any Feature you select. You can further refine a Feature's characteristics in its **Properties** page.




## To connect to the AccuRoute Queue Queue application:

Login to the system as a member of a Group with access rights to AccuRoute Queue.

Note When you launch AccuRoute Queue, it automatically pulls your Windows authentication information. If the authentication used does not have access permissions to a predefined Queue, you will not be able to login.

The AccuRoute Server Administrator, when creating a queue, defines which Group has access to the Queue. In addition, the administrator also defines the types of permissions the Group has. In order to login to AccuRoute Queue and access your Queue, you must be a member of the defined Group which has access to a Queue.

- 2 Click Start > All Programs > AccuRoute > AccuRoute Queue to launch the application.
- 3 You are prompted to connect to an AccuRoute Server.



- 4 In the **Server** drop down, select the AccuRoute Server name and enter the IP address of the AccuRoute Server. Alternately, manually enter the name of the AccuRoute Server.
- 5 Click OK.

## Configuring Queue Workflow rule for Link to Queue feature

The Link to Queue feature of AccuRoute Connect requires a Queue workflow rule for the External Applications folder for AccuRoute Queue is setup. Without this rule, jobs will not get routed to the External Applications folder, nor will it be listed in the AccuRoute Workflow Integration Application page (this is the page that opens when an user selects Link to Queue option in AccuRoute Connect).

## To configure the External Application Queue workflow rule:

- In the AccuRoute Server Administrator, go to the **Queues** node.
- 2 Select a Queue to configure. The **Properties** page opens.
- 3 Open the Workflow tab.
- 4 Click Add to open the Queue Workflow Rules Properties page.

- 7 Select Property Dictionary Item and click Next.

- II In the Application Code text box, enter IIC and click Finish.
- 12 Click OK to close the Queue Workflow Rules Properties page.

# AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client objects

The AccuRoute COM API supports the following objects:

- **EmbeddedDirective** object Represents an embedded directive. (An embedded directive is an encoded key that represents a set of routing instructions.)
- **EmbeddedDirectiveTemplate** object Represents a routing sheet template.
- Message object Represents a message on the AccuRoute server. (A message has at least one recipient or destination and at least one attachment.)
- MessageAttachment object Represents a file attachment to a message.
- MessageRecipient object Represents the recipient or destination of a message.
- **MessageServer** object Represents the message server.
- RecipientJournal object Represents the message journal. (The message journal is a log of events
  pertaining to the message; each time the server acts on a message, it adds an event to the journal and
  indicates whether the action was successful. If the action failed, the description of the event usually
  indicates the reason for the failure.)
- **ServConnect** object Represents a connection to the message server.
- **User** object Represents a user within your organization.
- **UserDelegate** object Represents a delegate. A delegate is a user who can manage the messages of another user, and/or send messages on behalf of another user.




Figure 6-1: AccuRoute Intelligent Device Client objects and their relationships

# Overview of AccuRoute CostRecovery configuration

After installing AccuRoute CostRecovery, you need to configure it to collect the type of information you need for your billing system. You can also configure the format the program uses to save information so that your billing system can read the information from the AccuRoute CostRecovery reports, and the price for the number of pages sent in faxes or e-mail messages.

## You can configure:

- The names and location of files that AccuRoute CostRecovery uses in the process of collecting
  information and generating reports for your billing system. These files include the output file generated
  by AccuRoute CostRecovery, the template file used to format output, and log files to which
  AccuRoute CostRecovery writes information about its processing. See Configuring AccuRoute
  CostRecovery file locations (6-19).
- The type of information collected and the format of the information in the output report that
  AccuRoute CostRecovery generates. The type of information available for collection differs depending
  on whether you use AccuRoute CostRecovery with Genifax or AccuRoute. See Working with fields,
  delimiters, and masks (6-22).
- Whether AccuRoute CostRecovery includes entire billing codes or only portions of the billing codes.
  If only a portion of the billing codes is used, you can configure how AccuRoute CostRecovery extracts that portion from the whole billing code. See <u>Including billing codes in AccuRoute CostRecovery output</u> (6-29).
- The prices AccuRoute CostRecovery assigns to message transactions. The transactions available for pricing differ depending on whether you use AccuRoute CostRecovery with Genifax or AccuRoute.

# Configuring AccuRoute CostRecovery file locations

AccuRoute CostRecovery uses or creates a number of files in the process of collecting information about message transactions. You can configure the names of these files and their locations if you want to specify names different from the default names. The files for which you can configure this information are:

- Output File This is the file that AccuRoute CostRecovery generates when it runs and collects information from Genifax or AccuRoute. You must specify this information before AccuRoute CostRecovery can run properly. By default, the output file is called cr.txt, and is located in the installation directory for Genifax or AccuRoute. For example: \Program Files\AccuRoute\AccuRoute CostRecovery\cr.txt
- **Template File** This is the file that AccuRoute CostRecovery uses to generate the output file. By default, this file is called AccuRoute CostRecovery.txt.

**Note** The template file specifies the type of information AccuRoute CostRecovery collects as well as the format in which it saves the information. You should configure this information according to the requirements of your company and your billing system. See <u>Working with fields</u>, <u>delimiters</u>, <u>and masks</u> (6-22).

- **Temporary File** AccuRoute CostRecovery uses this file in the collection process. This file is removed at the end of the process. By default, this file is called AccuRoute CostRecovery.tmp.
- Log File AccuRoute CostRecovery writes to this file each time it runs. It writes a brief summary of the export process, including the date and time at which AccuRoute CostRecovery runs, the status of the collection, and how many message transactions were collected, and whether any errors were encountered. By default, this file is called AccuRoute CostRecovery.log.
- **Server Name** This option is not a file, but the name of the Genifax or AccuRoute server to which AccuRoute CostRecovery must connect to collect information about the calls made, the messages sent, or other document transactions that occur. This option is initially set during the installation of AccuRoute CostRecovery, but can be modified at any time.


# Selecting the location of the AccuRoute CostRecovery output file

The output file that AccuRoute CostRecovery generates each time it runs should be stored in a location to which either the employees who process accounting information or your billing system have access. If your billing system can automatically retrieve the output file from a particular location, configure AccuRoute CostRecovery to save the file to the appropriate location. If the folder to which the output file is saved is located on a separate system from your billing system, ensure that the folder is shared with the necessary permissions so the billing system can access the file.

# Configuring the names and locations of AccuRoute CostRecovery files

### To configure the names and locations of AccuRoute CostRecovery files:

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click **Configure** in the **Standard** group in the left column.



2 Go to the fields under **File Locations** in the **Options** tab, and enter the full path to and name of the AccuRoute CostRecovery file as you want it to be, or click the open folder button beside the appropriate file's field to select the location.

**Note** You need only modify the name and location of the files you want to modify; you can leave the other files with their default settings.

3 Click Apply to save your changes.

# Configuring output data

AccuRoute CostRecovery saves the information it collects from or AccuRoute to an output file, which you then import into your billing system. You can customize the output to meet the needs of your billing system and your company. You can:

- Specify the name and location of this file. (Go to Configuring the names and locations of CostRecovery files on 6-20.)
- Configure the type of information AccuRoute CostRecovery collects, as well as the format in which it saves the information in the output file. (Go to <u>Configuring the export format and creating the</u> <u>template file</u> on 6-22.)
- Configure the removal of certain digits from the dialed fax number if your phone system requires extra
  digits to be dialed. (Go to <u>Configuring the removal of digits from fax numbers</u> on 6-28.)

The type of information collected and the format in which it is saved in the AccuRoute CostRecovery output file is specified in a template file. You do not need to modify the file itself; when you make changes on the **Export Format** tab in AccuRoute CostRecovery, the information is automatically stored in the template file.

# Using the skip list to omit message types

CostRecovery can omit messages that do not contain billing data. A skip list is located in the configuration file LFCostRecoveryU.ini. Items can be added based on a destination field type containing a destination field type value. For example,

A skipped item consists of three components:

- **TS number** An item in the TrxSkipList section must appear on a separate line, and the line must be begin with a TrxSkipList identifier. The identifier is simply a way to identify each item in the skip list. The formula for creating an identifier is TS+1. If the first item in the skip list has the identifier TS1, the second item is TS2, the third item is TS3, and so on. This identifier ensures that CostRecovery parses the codes correctly.
- **destination field code** The destination field code is a code that represents the field that is used as the key to identifying items that should be skipped. For example, if you want to identify
- destination code -

#### To add an item to the skip list:

- Log on to the AccuRoute server, go to ...\AccuRoute\CostRecovery, and open LFCostRecoveryU.ini in Notepad.
- **2** Go to [TrxSkipList]. It is the last section in the file.
- 3 Add or modify the items as preferred.
- 4 Save and close the file.

## Working with fields, delimiters, and masks

Your billing system may require that information in the AccuRoute CostRecovery file it imports be in a specific format. This can include the order of the information in the file and the delimiter used to separate the information in the file. The type of information collected and the format of that information is defined by the AccuRoute CostRecovery template file. AccuRoute CostRecovery uses the template as a guide for creating the output file.

Information that is written to the AccuRoute CostRecovery output file is represented in the template file by field names. The list of fields in AccuRoute CostRecovery from which you can select uses the common text descriptions of the information the fields hold, not the actual field names (for example, you will see "Second billing field (Client)" instead of the field name, "<Billing2>"). When you add a field to the template file, the field at the bottom of the **Export Format** tab shows the actual field name, along with the selected delimiter and a mask, if specified.

AccuRoute CostRecovery supports a number of delimiters to separate information in the template. The delimiter is

also used to separate information in the output file. Supported delimiters include a comma (,), semi-colon (;), colon (:), pipe (|), dash (-), and a tab. Use the appropriate delimiters for your billing system. Consult your billing system documentation for more information about its requirements.


If the data represented by a field you add contains the delimiter you use to separate the fields from one another (for example, Robert Jones, Marketing Administrator), use the **Surround Strings with Quotes** option to enclose that field between quotation marks. This prevents the data in the output file from being misread. For example, if the data that replaces a field contains a comma and you use a comma to delimit the fields, the data before the comma will be read separately from the data after the comma. For example: *Robert Jones, Marketing Administrator* will be read as *Robert Jones* and *Marketing Administrator* unless the entire field is surrounded in quotes ("Robert Jones, Marketing Administrator").

A mask is a way of specifying the pattern or format AccuRoute CostRecovery uses when adding information to the output file. A mask can also define the specific information that AccuRoute CostRecovery places in the output file, which is helpful if your billing system needs only a portion of information provided by Genifax, or AccuRoute (for example, the last four digits of a seven-digit billing code). Your billing system may expect information to be in a specific format when it reads the output file from AccuRoute CostRecovery. For example, you may want to include the date and time at which a message was sent, and because your billing system expects this information in a specific format, you can apply a mask to this field so the information is correctly formatted.

Masks are also used when your billing system requires information in fields of fixed length. To handle fixed length output, use a mask instead of a field delimiter. The mask should ensure that each field is the proper length. For example, if your billing system requires the cost of the message to be a five digit field with a decimal point (a total length of six characters), the mask you use would ensure that the output is always six characters—for example, the mask would format 1.50 as 001.50.

# Configuring the export format and creating the template file

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click **Configure** in the Standard group in the column on the left and click the **Export Format** tab.




- Add all required fields with the appropriate delimiters and masks if necessary. See Adding fields and delimiters (6-24) and Adding a field with a mask (6-26) on page 18.
- Place the cursor after the last field in the display list box on the **Export Format** tab and press **Delete** several times to ensure that no blank lines remain at the end of the template file.
- 4 Click **Apply** to save your changes to the AccuRoute CostRecovery output file.

Tip By default, the output file is called cr.txt and is located in the \Program


Files\AccuRoute\AccuRoute CostRecovery folder. You can specify the name and location of the output file if you want to have AccuRoute CostRecovery store the information in a different location, or if your billing system expects a different file name. See Configuring the names and locations of AccuRoute CostRecovery files (6-21).

## Adding fields and delimiters

I Go to the **Export Format** tab of the AccuRoute CostRecovery window, and select the field you want to add from the list box.




- 2 Select **Surround strings with quotes** if the information represented by the selected field needs to be enclosed in quotation marks in the output file.
- 3 Click in the list box at the bottom of the Export Format tab to place the cursor where you want to insert the field.
- 4 Click Insert Field to add the field to the list box. The selected field appears in the display list box




where the cursor was located.

Tip If any of the fields you add require a mask, refer to the following section.




- **5** Go to the **Delimiters** list, and select the delimiter you want to separate the field you just added from the next field you add.
- 6 Click **Insert Delimiter**. The delimiter appears in the display list box after the last field you added (or where the cursor was located).



# Adding a field with a mask

Go to the Export Format tab of the AccuRoute CostRecovery window, and select the field you want to add from the list box.



- 2 Select **Surround strings with quotes** if the information represented by the selected field needs to be enclosed in quotation marks in the output file.
- 3 Select Use mask with this field.
- 4 Click in the list box at the bottom of the **Export Format** tab to place the cursor where you want to insert the field.



5 Click Insert Field. The Enter Mask for Field dialog box appears.



**6** Go to the **Mask Format** field and enter the format for the information as you want it to appear in the output file.

The **Valid Mask Characters for this field are** box shows the valid characters you can include in the mask for the selected field. The characters listed here vary depending on the field you selected. All of the possible characters are described in <u>Appendix: Supported Mask Characters</u>.

For example, for the selected field (Date), you might want the date the message was sent to be formatted "Mon Dec 30 1990." To create a mask to format the date in this way, you would enter the following text in the Mask Format field: ddd mmm dd yyyy


You can include separators in the date, such as a comma (Mon, Dec 30, 1990). The format of the mask would appear as follows: ddd, mmm dd, yyyy

7 Click Apply to test the specified mask.

AccuRoute CostRecovery applies the mask you specified to the sample data listed in the **Sample Data** field, and displays the result in the **Result** field.



- 8 Make changes to the specified mask if needed based on the results of the test.
- 9 Click **OK** to add the field with the mask. The selected field appears in the list box where the cursor is located; the field includes the mask.




10 Add a delimiter to follow the field you just added. See <u>Adding fields and delimiters</u> (6-23) for information about adding a delimiter.

# Appending and overriding output data

By default, AccuRoute CostRecovery appends new report information to the output file each time it runs. You can disable this option if you want to have AccuRoute CostRecovery overwrite the output file each time it runs. AccuRoute recommends that you leave the default and configure your billing system to delete the output file after importing it. This is recommended especially if AccuRoute CostRecovery runs automatically each day. This ensures that no data is lost if for some reason the import of the information into your billing system fails.

# To configure AccuRoute CostRecovery to overwrite the contents of the output file each time it executes:

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click **Configure** in the Standard group in the column on the left.



- 2 Click the **Options** tab.
- 3 Clear Append to Existing Output File.
- 4 Click Apply to save your changes.


## Configuring the removal of digits from fax numbers

Some phone systems require extra digits to be dialed prior to the phone number or fax number. These extra digits are stored in the Genifax message database with the fax numbers. In such cases, you might want to have these digits removed from the fax numbers prior to adding them to your billing system. AccuRoute CostRecovery can remove the extra digits from the fax numbers as it collects call information from Genifax.

**Note** This does not include the digit 9 that is commonly required to obtain an outside line. If your phone system requires only a 9, you do not need to configure the removal of extra digits from fax numbers.

## To configure AccuRoute CostRecovery to remove extra digits from fax numbers:

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click Configure in the Standard group in the column on the left.



- 2 Click the **Options** tab.
- 3 Go to the Digits to remove from beginning of phone number field and enter the extra digits that must be removed from the beginning of fax numbers.
- 4 Click Apply to save your changes.

# Including billing codes in AccuRoute CostRecovery output

You can have AccuRoute CostRecovery include billing codes in the output files it generates. If you want billing codes included, you need to add the billing code fields to the AccuRoute CostRecovery template file. By default, AccuRoute CostRecovery includes the entire billing code in the output file, but you can provide information about how your billing codes are formatted and which portion of the code you want AccuRoute CostRecovery to collect, if your billing system requires only a portion of the billing codes provided by the senders of messages. For example, if your billing codes are six digits in length, but you only need the last four digits for your billing system, you can configure AccuRoute CostRecovery to pull out the four digits you need.

AccuRoute CostRecovery provides the ability to configure the format for three billing code elements: user ID code, client code, and matter code. On the **Billing** tab in AccuRoute CostRecovery, these elements are represented by **Billing Fields I**, **2**, and **3**. Typically, **Billing Field I** corresponds to the user ID code, **Billing Field 2** corresponds to the client code, and **Billing Field 3** corresponds to the matter. Your firm may have other names for these fields.

## Configuring the billing code separator

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click **Configure** in the Standard group in the column on the left

#### and click the Billing tab.



Go to the **Billing Field Separator** field under **All Fields** and enter the separator character that your billing codes contain, if one is used.

**Note** The separator character applies to all billing code types (for example, user ID code, client code, and matter code).

3 Click Apply to save your changes.

## Including the entire billing code in AccuRoute CostRecovery output

## To configure the inclusion of the entire billing code in AccuRoute CostRecovery output:

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click **Configure** in the Standard group in the column on the left and click the **Billing** tab.



- 2 Go to the section that corresponds to the billing code type that you want AccuRoute CostRecovery to include (Billing Field I (user), Billing Field 2 (client), or Billing Field 3 (matter), and complete the following steps:
  - a Clear Enable Parsing of field.
  - b Select Strip Leading Zeros if you want any leading zeros stripped from the front of this type of billing code. For example, 003456 becomes 3456. Leading zeros are not stripped if the billing code contains alpha characters.
  - c Click Apply to save your changes.

# Customizing the billing code

To configure the inclusion of a portion of a billing code in AccuRoute CostRecovery output files:

I Start AccuRoute CostRecovery and click **Configure** in the Standard group in the column on the left and click the **Billing** tab.



- 2 Go to the section that corresponds to the billing code type you want AccuRoute CostRecovery to include (Billing Field I (user), Billing Field 2 (client), or Billing Field 3 (matter)), and complete the following steps:
  - a Select Enable Parsing of field.
  - b Select Strip Leading Zeros if you want any leading zeros stripped from the front of this type of billing code. For example, 003456 becomes 3456. Leading zeros are not stripped if the billing code contains alpha characters.
  - Go to the Start Position field and enter the position number of the digit with which you want AccuRoute CostRecovery to begin extracting from the billing code. Count position numbers from left to right.

For example, if your billing codes are all 6 digits (123456) and you want AccuRoute CostRecovery to extract digits 2 through 5, enter 2 as the start position.

Note If the billing codes of this type (user, client, or matter) are of varying lengths and AccuRoute CostRecovery encounters a billing code that contains fewer digits than specified in the **Start Position** and **Digits to Collect** fields, AccuRoute CostRecovery saves the billing code as it is in the output file.

**d** Go to the **Digits to Collect** field and enter the number of digits you want AccuRoute CostRecovery to extract from the billing code.

Following the example given in the previous step (c), you would enter 4 as the number of digits to collect because there are 4 digits between positions 2 and 5 (digits 2, 3, 4, and 5).

e Enter a name for the billing code in the **Billing Code Known As** field. For example, **Billing Field I** represents user ID information, so you might enter User ID in this field.

The information you provide in this field is for the benefit of those using AccuRoute CostRecovery, to help them know the purpose of the billing field.

3 Click Apply to save your changes.

# Required configuration for AccuRoute Connectors for Filescan and Telco

AccuRoute Server Monitor can run tests on folders associated with AccuRoute Connectors for Filescan and Telco. In order to run tests on these folders, the folders must be configured in UNC format. (UNC uses the format \computer\folder. Drive letter mappings, such as G:\folder\folder, are not supported.) If an AccuRoute Server has either of these connectors, complete required configuration in this section.

**Note** If you configure AccuRoute Server Monitor to run tests on a folder, verify that the Windows user account associated with the AccuRoute Server Monitor Service has sharing permissions on that folder and security permissions with read access.







# Registering AccuRoute FaxCenter users

In order to run FaxCenter, FaxCenter users must be Registered Users on the server. When you create a Registered User, you can enable the user as a FaxCenter user, assign the user permissions to use FaxCenter features, and configure other properties for this user.

Use the following procedure to create a user account in the Administrator under Registered Users. If you have already created a user account for the FaxCenter user, you will modify the user's FaxCenter properties.

## To create a new user or modify the FaxCenter properties of a registered user:

- I Start the Administrator.
- 2 Create a new user or modify the properties of an existing user:
  - ➤ To create a new user: Right-click Registered Users in the console tree and select New > User. Type the name and e-mail address of the FaxCenter user in the Name and E-mail text boxes.
  - **To modify the properties of an existing user**: Click **Registered Users** in the console tree and double-click a registered user in the details pane.
- 3 Click the **FaxCenter** tab.
- 4 If you want to enable this user to use FaxCenter, select the **Enable this user as a FaxCenter user** option, and then complete the following steps.
- If you want to assign a FaxCenter password to this user, type the password in the **Password** and **Confirm** text boxes. If you do not want to assign a password to this user, leave the text boxes empty.
- 6 When a FaxCenter user selects a fax in FaxCenter, the fax becomes locked so other FaxCenter users cannot access the same fax. (This prevents multiple FaxCenter users from modifying or routing the same fax.) Type the number of minutes you want FaxCenter to wait before it unlocks the fax this user has selected in the **Automatically unlock fax after** \_\_ minutes spin box.
- 7 You can create an e-mail address filter that limits the users whose e-mail addresses appear in the FaxCenter Routing dialog box.

**Note** The filter does not prevent the FaxCenter user from routing faxes to other recipients and destinations.

If you want to create a filter, do one of the following:

- ➤ To create an e-mail address filter, use the following string: email=[e-mail address of a user account] For example: email=user@company.com
- ➤ To create a site filter, use the following string: site=[name of the Exchange 5.5 site] For example: site=Finance
- ➤ To create a name filter, use the following string: name=[alias of a user account]

For example: name=jsmith

**Note** The values you use in filters are not case-sensitive.

- Tip You can use an asterisk to indicate a wildcard. For example, if email=\*@company.com, then FaxCenter displays the e-mail accounts in the domain you specified as potential routing destinations—in this case, "company" is the domain you specified.
- 8 In the **Allow User to** section, select the check box beside each option you want to enable for this user:
  - Delete Faxes Allow this user to delete faxes from the Processed Items list in FaxCenter.
  - Move to processed Allow this user to move faxes from the New Items list into the Processed Items list.
  - Combine Faxes Allow this user to combine multiple faxes and route them as one combined fax.
  - **View Entire Fax** Allow this user to view the entire fax. If this option is not enabled, the FaxCenter user can view only the first page of each fax.
  - ▶ Enter originator information when routing Allow this user to complete the Routing Transaction Description section of the Route Selected Item dialog box when routing a fax. This configuration setting has two additional options that you can enable:
    - ▲ User may leave From empty Select this if you want the FaxCenter user to be able to leave the From field under Routing Transaction Description empty, or clear this check box if you want to require the user to provide the From information.
    - ▲ User may leave Company empty Select this if you want the FaxCenter user to be able to leave the Company field under Routing Transaction Description empty, or clear this check box if you want to require the user to provide the Company information.
  - ▶ Enable or Disable Afterhours Processing Allow this user to set After Hours<sup>2</sup> for all FaxCenter users associated with the server.
  - Release Registration Pending (HIPAA) Allow this user to release faxes from Recipient Registration Pending to secure destinations.

Important Since releasing a fax can have legal ramifications in some industries, you should make sure that the FaxCenter user understands the process of secure delivery.

- 1. These fields allow the FaxCenter user to provide the fax recipient with information about the original fax sender. Depending on how you configure notification messages for faxes that have been routed from FaxCenter to e-mail recipients, these fields (From and Company) can appear in the notification message from the server.
- 2. You can create inbound or outbound routing rules that specify how the server should handle messages when it is after hours in your company. While this feature is versatile and can be configured in a variety of ways, it is most commonly used in conjunction with FaxCenter. If your company uses FaxCenter, people in your company rely on FaxCenter users to route inbound faxes in a timely manner. After Hours prevents someone in your company from missing an important fax when FaxCenter users are not in the office. When it is after hours in your company, you might want to consider routing inbound faxes to network printers so that people can retrieve them when they arrive. 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- ▶ View all Faxes in FaxCenter Allow this user to view all faxes in FaxCenter, even those faxes that have not been routed directly to this user for processing. When this option is enabled, this user can view all faxes on the server that currently reside in the FaxCenter Routing state. Also, this user can see faxes in all queues, including New Items, Processed Items, Found Items, and Registration Pending.
- Select the **Route faxes as** check box if you want the server to send the routing recipient a notification message that includes a name and an e-mail address for this FaxCenter user. If you select the check box, provide the following information:
  - Name Type the name you want to appear in the **From** field on all faxes that this user routes from FaxCenter. For example, the name can be the name of the user or another name, such as "John Smith, fax router" or "John Smith".
- 10 E-mail Type the e-mail address you want to appear in the From field on all faxes that this user forwards from FaxCenter. For example, the e-mail address can be associated with the FaxCenter user or another person who you want to receive all replies to the forwarded fax.
- II Click the **Select Columns to View** button if you want to configure the columns that this user will view in FaxCenter. Modify the column properties and save your changes.
- 12 Click **OK** to save your changes to the properties for this registered user, or click on another tab to modify more properties for this user.

Note When you modify a user's FaxCenter permissions while that user is currently logged into FaxCenter, the new permissions will not take effect until the next time the user logs in to FaxCenter.

# About AccuRoute Desktop and server clusters

For an environment of the AccuRoute Desktop with an AccuRoute server cluster, additional configurations are necessary before you install AccuRoute Desktop. Resources that are utilized by the AccuRoute server and AccuRoute Desktop clients need to be relocated to a high availability server. This ensures that the active server in the cluster and all clients have uninterrupted access to them.

These resources include:

- View files
- Routing Sheet templates and cover page templates

Copy these resources to a high availability server, and then edit the registry on the AccuRoute server and the configuration file in the AccuRoute Desktop setup so that the AccuRoute server and AccuRoute Desktop clients can begin using the resources on the high availability server immediately.

#### Copying server and client resources to a high availability server

Before completing this procedure, choose a high availability server. AccuRoute recommends using the same high availability server where the AccuRoute server message database is located. If a different server is used, then it must be located in the same domain as the AccuRoute server or in a different domain that has a bidirectional trust with the AccuRoute server's domain. Access to the folders containing these resources is granted through the sharing and security rights on the folder itself.

#### To copy server and client resources to the high availability server:

- I Go to ...\UplandAccuRoute\AccuRoute\ directory on the AccuRoute server.
- 2 Copy and paste \AccuRouteViews to the high availability server and wait for the files to be copied.
- Go to \AccuRouteViews on the high availability server and verify that its sharing and security permissions allow clients running AccuRoute Desktop to access it:
  - a Right-click AccuRouteViews and select Properties.
  - b Click the Sharing tab.
  - c Verify that the folder is shared as AccuRouteViews.
  - d Click Permissions and verify that Everyone has Read access to the folder.

- 4 Go to ...\UplandAccuRoute\AccuRoute Server\ on the AccuRoute server.
- 5 Copy and paste \Languages to the high availability server and wait for the files to be copied.
- **6** Go to \Languages on the high availability server and set the sharing and security permissions:
  - a Right-click Languages and select Properties.
  - b Click the **Sharing** tab.
  - c Select **Share this folder**. and verify that the share name is Languages.
  - **d** Click **Permissions** and verify that Everyone has Read access to the folder.
  - e Click **OK** to close the Permissions dialog box, and click **OK** to save the changes to the folder properties.

#### Editing the registry on the AccuRoute Server

The location of \LANGUAGES is stored in the registry on the AccuRoute server. Instead of moving the location of the Languages folder, you can when needed, move the logical \TEMPLATES. It is in the same location as \LANGUAGES.

The logical \TEMPLATES can point to any UNC path (or other path) as long as it maintains the same sub-folder structure as the original, thereby allowing a single copy of the templates to be maintained for the clustered server.

The default value for the \TEMPLATES logical is the same as the LANGUAGES folder, located in: \HKEY LOCAL MACHINE\SOFTWARE\AccuRoute\Genifax\Current Version\Logicals.

All folders except the "Resources" folders in the default install LANGUAGES folder can be moved as templates.

**Note** Resources must remain on each individual machine.

#### **Editing the AccuRoute Desktop configuration file**

AccuRoute Desktop is installed on clients with a configuration file that defines the locations of resources to which the client needs access. This configuration file must be modified to include the new location of view files. Optionally, it can be edited to include the location of the folder containing Routing Sheet templates.

**Note** This procedure updates the AccuRoute Desktop setup. This ensures that no configuration is required on the client after installation.

- I To update the AccuRoute Desktop setup with the new location of the folder containing view files:
- **2** Go to \UplandAccuRoute\AccuRoute\Clients\AccuRouteDesktop\program files\AccuRoute\AccuRouteDesktop on the AccuRoute server.
- 3 Open AccuRouteclient.xml in Notepad.
- **4** Go to the **Aliases** section. (Search on SearchFolders if necessary.)
- 5 Locate the following alias:

```
<Alias>
<prValue>$/</prValue>
</Alias>
```

**6** Replace \$/ with \\[server]\AccuRouteViews where [server] is the computer name or IP address of the high availability server.

Note The AccuRouteViews folder is shared, and its share name is AccuRouteViews, so the path to this resource is always \\[server]\AccuRouteViews.

7 Save the file and close it.

Note AccuRoute strongly recommends repeating this procedure on the alternate AccuRoute Server.

Second, notice that the top and bottom positions are modified together. If only the top position is moved toward the bottom of the form, the overall height of the control is decreased. If only the bottom position is moved toward the bottom of the form, the overall height of the control is increased, and in this case, the control would appear to be stretched when the view is loaded.

- prBottom Bottom position of the control. Specify a relative or absolute workspace coordinate. See prTop (above) for a code sample.
- prLeft Left position of the control. Specify a relative or absolute workspace coordinate.

- 7 Select Route to AccuRoute Queue option and click Next. The Route to AccuRoute Queue page opens.
- 8 In the Select an AccuRoute Queue settings section, check the Specific Queue option. From the drop-down menu, select the Queue email address: <a href="mailto:queue@yourcompany.com">queue@yourcompany.com</a>.
- 9 Click Finish, then Next, Next and Finish to create the rule.



# Adding the AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator snap-in to a Remote Administrator

If you have a Remote Administrator MMC, you can add AccuRoute Server Monitor to the MMC console.

To add AccuRoute Server Monitor to the Omtool Remote Administrator:


- I Open the Omtool Administrator.
- 2 Select Console and select Add/Remove Snap-in.



3 Click Add to view a list of available snap-ins.



4 Scroll down the list of available snap-ins, select **AccuRoute Server Monitor Administrator**, and click **Add**. The **Specify AccuRoute Server Monitor** window appears.



- **5** Enter the Network IP Address or name of the server you wish to monitor.
- 6 Click Finish, click Close, and then click OK.



#### **Defining the Suspend Monitor tab**

The Suspend Monitor feature allows you to suspend monitoring of the server for specified dates and times.

To open the Suspend Monitor tab in the server properties:

Right-click the server, select **Properties**, and then Click the **Suspend Monitor** tab. (Or, highlight the server, click **Action** on the toolbar, select **Properties**, and Click the **Suspend Monitor** tab.)



The available options are:

Add - Allows you to enter new days and times to suspend monitoring.


**Remove** - Allows you to delete single or multiple suspend monitoring specifications.

**Properties** - Allows you to modify specifications for an existing Suspend Monitor item. You can only modify one item at a time.

#### Adding a new suspend monitoring specification

#### To add a new suspend monitoring specification:

I Click **Add** on the Suspend Monitor tab. The **Suspend Monitor Data** screen appears.



- 2 Select the **Days of the Week** and the **Time Period** for which you want to suspend monitoring.
- 3 Click OK.

#### Removing a suspend monitoring specification

Use the following procedure to remove a suspend monitoring specification.


To remove a suspend monitoring specification:

- I Highlight an existing specification on the **Suspend Monitor** tab. You can also select multiple specifications using **CTRL-Click** and **Shift-Click**.
- 2 Click Remove.
- 3 Read the Are you sure you want to delete the selected item? message. Click Yes to delete it or No to keep it.
- 4 Click **OK** to close the **Suspend Monitor** tab.

### Modifying the specifications for an existing Suspend Monitor item

#### To modify a suspend monitoring specification:

I Highlight the item on the **Suspend Monitor** tab and click **Properties**. The **Suspend Monitor Data** screen appears.



2 Make any changes needed and click **OK**.

## AccuRoute FaxCenter

## Sending a test fax

Using the following procedure, you will send a test fax. Before you send the fax, you must consider the inbound routing rule you created for FaxCenter. The inbound fax will only be routed from the server to FaxCenter if the fax matches the criteria you specified in this routing rule. If necessary, you might need to modify this rule for the purposes of testing the fax. For example, if the routing rule specifies that all inbound faxes will be routed from the server to FaxCenter on Fridays only, you might need to modify this rule to include the day you are sending the test fax—unless you are sending the test fax on a Friday.

#### To send a test fax:

From any fax machine—including those inside your company, send a fax to a fax number in your company.

Tip If you want to track the progress of the fax on the server, you can view the journal for that fax in the Administrator. The journal contains a log of events related to that fax.

## Retrieving the test fax in FaxCenter

Using the following procedure, you will launch FaxCenter on the client system and locate the test fax in the New **Items** queue.

#### To locate the test fax:

- I Log on to the client system.
- 2 Click the Start button and select Programs > FaxCenter > FaxCenter Console. The Connect to Server dialog box appears.
- 3 Type the computer name or IP address of the server in the **Server** text box, type the e-mail address of the FaxCenter user in the **E-mail** text box, type the appropriate password for the FaxCenter user in the **Password** text box, and click **Connect**.
- 4 Click on the test fax in the **New Items** queue to view it in the page view pane.
  - Tip If the test fax does not appear in the **New Items** queue, you can troubleshoot the fax from the Administrator. See "Click the Journal tab." on page 56.

**Note** Depending on the permissions you configured for the FaxCenter login account, you might only be able to view the first page of the fax or the entire fax.

5 Click the Journal tab.

## Routing the test fax from FaxCenter to an e-mail account

Once you can view the test fax in FaxCenter, you should route it to an e-mail account that you can access. After you route the fax from FaxCenter to an e-mail account and retrieve the fax from the e-mail account, you will have simulated the steps that will occur when your company receives actual faxes.

When a FaxCenter user routes an inbound fax, the user can route the fax to e-mail recipients, network printers, fax machines, and your company's document management system or document repository. However, you will route the test fax to an e-mail account because it will be easy for you to retrieve it. This also allows you to test the mail connector that moves faxes to your mail server for delivery.

Using the following procedure, you will open the test fax in FaxCenter and route it to an e-mail account that you can access.

#### To route the test fax to your e-mail account:

- I Start FaxCenter, log in, and click on the test fax in the **New Items** queue. (If the **New Items** queue does not appear, click **View** and select **New Items**.)
- 2 Click **Edit** and select **Route Item**. The **Route Selected Item** dialog box appears.
- 3 Select your e-mail address from the list on the left and click the **Add Recipient** button, or type your e-mail address in the **Type destination or select from list** text box and click the **Add** button.
- In the **Pages to route** text box, indicate the pages you want to route by selecting **All Pages** from the drop-down menu or typing the page numbers in the text box.
- 5 Under **Routing Transaction Description**, type the name of the original sender in the **Name** text box, the original sender's company name in the *Company* text box, and your comments about the fax in the **Comments** text box.
  - Depending on the permissions you configured for the FaxCenter login account, you might have granted permissions for this user to leave the **Name** or **Company** fields empty.
- 6 Click **Route**. The server prepares and sends the fax to the destination you specified, and FaxCenter moves the fax to the Processed Items queue.
- 7 Log in to the e-mail account where you routed the test fax.
- 8 In your inbox, you should see a message indicating that a FaxCenter user has routed a fax to you. Follow the instructions in the e-mail to retrieve the test fax.

## Uninstalling AccuRoute Clients

#### To uninstall AccuRoute clients:

I On the system Control Panel, select Programs > Programs and Features > Uninstall or change a program.

OR

Click Start > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs.

- 2 Select **AccuRoute** [Client name] and click **Remove** / **Uninstall**., where [Client name] is the Client you want to uninstall.
- 3 Follow the prompts to remove the application.

To verify that AccuRoute client is removed, browse the directory structure on the client and verify that the client has been removed.

# Uninstalling Accuroute Clients in Silent Mode

#### To remove the AccuRoute client in silent mode:

- I Log on to the client with an account that belongs to the local Administrators group.
- 2 Copy the AccuRoute client setup directory to a local drive, or map a drive to the folder that contains the setup program. (The setup program is required to silently remove the application.)
- 3 Open a command prompt.
- **4** Set the current directory to the AccuRoute client setup directory.
- 5 Run: setup.exe /s /V"/qn REMOVE=ALL"

This removes AccuRoute client from the default location.

# Error when profiling DOCX and XLSX type documents to a Worksite v8.2 repository

**Problem:** When I try and profile a document of type DOCX or XLSX from AccuRoute Desktop v6.0 to a Worksite repository v8.2, the **Save** button is disabled and profiling fails.

**Solution:** When profiling a document from AccuRoute Desktop to WorkSite, the file type must be defined and cannot be blank. In this case, the **Type** field is blank which is the reason for the **Save** button is disabled.

WorkSite servers prior to v8.5 do not have the "out of the box" DOCX and XLSX file extensions in the registered file types. In order to use DOCX and XLSX file types, the WorkSite Administrator must add support for them by adding them to the list of registered types on the WorkSite server for a particular database. Once added, the Type field will be pre-populated in the new profile dialog for the DOCX, XLSX extensions.

#### To add the DOCX and XLSX document types in the Worksite server

- I Go to Worksite DMS 8.2 server system.
- 2 Navigate to Start> All Programs> Interwoven server> Database Administration. The Worksite Database management page opens.
- 3 Select **Type** to see the default file types supported list.
- 4 Right click and select Add. The Add Type page opens.
- 5 In the **Description** and **Alias** fields, specify appropriate values.
- 6 In the DMS extension field, enter %V.
- 7 In the App. Extension field enter DOCX.
- 8 Click OK

DOCX file format is added as a new file type and displayed along with the existing file types.

9 Similarly add the XLSX extension (In the App. Extension field enter XLSX.)

After you have added the file types, you can successfully profile documents with file types DOCX and XLSX to the Worksite v8.2 repository.

The information in the following sections will help you troubleshoot Server Monitor.

#### 1607 error

If you receive a 1607 error when installing Server Monitor, make sure you are not installing to a Windows Server that is running in Terminal Server Application mode. This is not a supported environment.

## Configuration file

All settings for Server Monitor are contained in the omsvrmonitor.config file. When the Server Monitor Services opens, it reads the settings contained in this file.

The omsvrmonitor.config file is located in the ...\AccuRoute\ServerMonitor directory.

**Note** In a clustered environment, when control passes to the secondary server, tests continue to be performed. The omsvrmonitor.config file, however, is not updated with the secondary server's name.

## Connecting to the Server Monitor Service

When the Server Monitor Administrator starts, it attempts to detect the Server Monitor Service locally. If the Server Monitor Service is not installed, the following error occurs: Failed to connect to specified monitor service (0x80040154). Click **OK** on the message box and proceed to Connecting to the AccuRoute Server Monitor Service (3-3).

## Tracking the status of the fax on the server

You can track the progress of the test fax on the server using the Administrator. If the server did not route the inbound fax to FaxCenter, did not deliver the fax for another reason, or paused during the processing of the fax, you can view the journal for that fax and see a log of events related to that fax.

Once the server routes the test fax to FaxCenter, you can view the journal for that fax in FaxCenter.

#### To view the test fax on the server:

- I Start the Administrator.
- 2 Expand the **Messages** item in the console tree and select **In Process**.

The **In Process** folder displays all messages and faxes being processed on the server. In the details pane, the top section displays a set of bar graphs, also called barometers, that represent the different processing phases of a fax. You can resize the Administrator window if necessary to view all the barometers.

Each barometer has a number that indicates the number of items in that processing phase. As items move through various phases of processing, the visual indicators on the barometers change in real-time.

Using these barometers, you can locate the processing phase of your test fax and watch it move through the other phases until the server dispatches the fax to FaxCenter.

3 Click the option button above the barometer you want to view.

If you cannot locate your test fax in the **In Process** queue, repeat these steps in the **History** queue.

- 4 Right-click on the test fax and select **Properties**.
- 5 Click the Journal tab.

Review the list of events. (Double-click an event to view more information about it.) If the server did not route the inbound fax to FaxCenter, did not deliver the fax, or paused during the processing of the fax, the journal provides you with the information you need to troubleshoot the issue.

Tip If you make any modifications to the settings on the server and you want to send your test fax again, you can resend the fax from the Administrator. ## Checking inbound routing rules

When you troubleshoot your test fax, make sure that you created an inbound routing rule for FaxCenter. Also, verify that the details in this rule will route faxes to FaxCenter and that the appropriate FaxCenter users should receive faxes. If you configured the server to route faxes to all FaxCenter users, all FaxCenter users should be able to view the test fax in the New Items queue. If you configured the server to route faxes to a particular FaxCenter user, only that user should be able to view the test fax in the New Items queue.

## Verify the installation of an image viewer

If an image viewer is not installed, you will not be able to view the test fax in FaxCenter.

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
